It is slowly becoming apparent that manufacturers might soon be successful in securing higher prices across the board. So far, mark-ups have taken hold only partially. A few suppliers told EUWID that they had already instituted price hikes with some clients, mostly in the region of €30-40/t for GD 2, with one manufacturer in particular reportedly having made pretty good progress. However, these hikes had yet to spread to the entire market in March, meaning that many GD 2 prices were still left untouched in the third month of 2025.

Many producers are still in discussions with their customers. Their plans to invoice more for white-lined chipboard are not easy to implement. Sources said that buyers are resisting higher prices as far or as long as possible, although they are said to have some understanding for the concerns raised by manufacturers. Producers are complaining about hefty costs, especially for energy and recovered paper. Manufacturers had absorbed a lot last year, but higher costs from 2024 now had to be passed on to

buyers, one white-lined chipboard producer said.

One manufacturer was especially firm and steadfast in its demands. This seller said that he was prepared to accept losing a few orders in the process, adding that some customers were indeed redistributing their orders. Others were more cautious. Generally speaking, though, buyers and suppliers alike expect that GD 2 prices will increase everywhere sooner or later. One manufacturer that had previously charged unchanged prices said in mid-March that it had now managed to secure the majority of orders for deliveries from April onwards at higher prices.

While some contracts reportedly apply for three months until the end of June, several manufacturers would rather opt for month-long agreements or prices applying until further notice.

Raising prices is difficult, not least because demand does not provide any real tailwind. The slight momentum in demand for both white-lined chipboard and fresh fibre cartonboard

(folding boxboard) since the beginning of 2025 is still evident, insiders said, and manufacturers were pleased with their order books in March. One producer told EUWID that sales volumes were in line with last year's level, while another even saw a minor year-on-year improvement. However, insiders still do not have the impression that this momentum represents signs of a turnaround. "It has been a good month, but the situation remains fragile," one market player remarked.

Market players put current lead times at 3-4 weeks for GD board and 3-6 weeks for GC.

There was not much action on the folding box-board market in March. The price round starting back in the summer of 2024 that gradually led to mark-ups for GC 2 was only recently completely wrapped up. Manufacturers are now waiting to see how prices develop on the white-lined chipboard market. Higher costs, especially those for pulp wood, are viewed as problematic here, too, with

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
