second quarter. Only suppliers that were already offering particularly low prices were spared.

The paper industry's customers were rarely satisfied with the outcome of price talks, either. At times, bigger price cuts appeared possible, and they would have gladly secured a mark-down of €20-30/t for newsprint and magazine paper deliveries in the third quarter. One buyer stressed to EUWID that prices of this kind, e.g. around €580/t free delivered for standard newsprint 42 g (or even 40 g), had been available on the market for some time and certainly deserved to be reflected in list prices. When all was said and done, though, buyers mostly had to settle for smaller price adjustments.

According to a few insiders, there was still quite a bit of room for savings. One customer reported having managed to negotiate its suppliers down to an almost uniform level, and, starting in July, was paying €590-600/t for 42 g standard newsprint. Another printing company said that it was only buying newsprint at prices below €600/t free de-

livered. Yet another buyer mentioned working with monthly prices, wherever possible, in the hope of securing additional reductions from September onwards.

Persistently poor capacity utilisation is actually hurting paper mills more than new, lower prices. This is especially apparent for magazine paper, with coated magazine paper producers criticising a lack of contract business. Sources lamented a lack of continuity and planning reliability because orders and sales prices are highly project-specific and are thus being renegotiated again and again. Yet newsprint and uncoated magazine paper manufacturers also had to keep scrambling for new orders just to keep capacity utilisation at reasonable levels.

The bankruptcy of German manufacturer Kabel Premium in the first quarter of this year has done little to curb the supply in the coated magazine paper market. Now, Finnish producer UPM has announced plans to shut down LWC production at its Kaukas mill by the end of the year, removing 300,000 tpy of capacity from the market. UPM is also planning to close its Ettringen mill, which has a production capacity of 270,000 tpy of SC paper and improved newsprint in the second half of this year.

No further announcements of capacity reduction projects had been made in Europe as July came to a close. However, EUWID sources generally do not rule out additional measures to be announced by the year's end.

Even though demand is contracting on the whole, Canadian newsprint is becoming more readily available in Italy and across Europe. This primary fibre-based paper is offered in basis weights below 40 g/m², which could offer significant cost savings for paper buyers. Imports into Italy had already doubled to reach roughly 27,000 t between 2023 and 2024. According to Eurostat, the first five months of 2025 saw another 40 per cent increase in imports compared to the same period last year.
